

✓ Information Overload:


Difficulty understanding a topic or making decisions due to too much information

Kids and Video Games Stats

- 61% play video games on a given day.
- ✓ Average Time: 2 hours 13 minutes
- ✓ Boys > Girls
- ✓ 14% boys, 5% girls play 4 to 10 hrs/day.
- ✓ Do parents limit kids' screen time?
 - 94% parents say YES
 - 48% report a "constant battle"
 - 72% youth say NO
 - Those with no rules play twice as much



- ✓ Mental Rotation









Assessment and Diagnosis

How do I know my patient is addicted to technology?

Same as All Addiction

- ✓ Tolerance and Withdrawal
- ✓ Internal Concerns
- External Consequences




Treatments

What can I do about it?

Psychotherapy

- ✓ Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT)
- Motivational Interviewing (MI)


Medications

- We have no approved medications for any Technological Addiction.
- Treat co-occurring psychiatric disorders.



New Directions

Arousal and Control



A Technological Addiction as an Arousal - Impulsive Disorder

- Opioid Antagonists
 - Decrease dopamine function by blocking opioid receptors.
 - Reduce the "high."

A Technological Addiction as a Control - Compulsive Disorder

- Selective Serotonin Reuptake Inhibitors (SSRIs)
 - Increase serotonin function by blocking serotonin reuptake receptors.
 - Decrease obsessiveness.

Conclusions

- Internet Gaming, Cybersex, Internet Gambling, Infobesity, Social Media, Texting & Emailing, and Online Auctions & Shopping are the major Technological Addictions in 2023.
- 2. Continued use despite knowledge of adverse consequences is the hallmark of diagnosis.
- Cognitive Behavior Therapy and Motivational Interviewing are effective treatments.
- 4. We have no approved medications for the treatment of any Technological Addiction.
